Re: Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) Tool Kits

Over the past several years The U.S. Conference of Mayors has been involved in a partnership with the Annie E. Casey Foundation to call attention to what mayors can do to help working families achieve economic success. To assist mayors in doing this, the Conference is working with Casey to promote the development of local campaigns to encourage working families to take advantage of federal tax credits, especially the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and the Child Tax Credit (CTC).

Enclosed please find the 2009 Earned Income Credit and Child Care Tax Outreach Tool Kit compiled by the Center for Budget and Policy Priorities, which includes specific guidelines to help you establish EITC programs in your city. Additional information and resources on EITC can also be obtained from the Internal Revenue Service website (www.irs.gov).

Every year the EITC lifts more families out of poverty than any other program the federal government offers. However, it still remains one of the most underutilized programs. The EITC is a refundable tax credit available to working families and individuals earning low-to-moderate incomes. This year eligible working families can receive as much as \$4,824 from the EITC.
