## Dear Chairman McDermott:

I am writing on behalf of The United States Conference of Mayors in support of *HR 2909 "The Measuring American Poverty Act of 2009."* In these uncertain economic times, the nation's mayors believe it is important that the tool used to measure poverty be reflective of modern realities.

Earlier this month, at our 77<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting, the mayors reaffirmed their strong support for developing a national-poverty measure that accounts for costs and expenditures of today's working families. The mayors adopted policy that recommends the federal government revise the formula for calculating the federal poverty line so that it better reflects the amount which families must earn to meet the basic costs of daily life, and that it include factors such as the cost of housing, transportation, health care and child care, in addition to the cost of food. Changing this measurement also was one of the top priorities of the USCM Poverty, Work and Opportunity Task Force, chaired by Los Angeles Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa.

We believe that accurately measuring poverty creates a fairer and more balanced playing field for those families struggling to meet their basic needs. We look forward to working with you to pass this much-needed legislation.
