Short Term Contracts – Entry Level Draftsman \$10-15/hr

Why useful – simulates engineering business process

Statistics and the Mechanics of Fixing Broken Lives

60% of Denver's homeless are families w/children

29% are women

40% are working

Common reasons for homelessness

Loss of job – 28%

Cost of housing – 23%

Breakup of family – 20%

Since Denver's Road Home

11% decrease in homelessness

36% decrease chronic homelessness

Prior to DRH - Annual Spending - \$70 million

Shelter, healthcare, services
