Dear Colleague:

We write to request your support for the fiscal year 2008 Labor, HHS, and Education Appropriations bill as it moves toward conference. We particularly would like you to restore \$1 billion in cuts to Workforce Investment Act (WIA) programs proposed by the Administration in its FY 08 budget request.

The Administration's funding request for WIA programs, which included a \$335 million rescission to current year WIA formula funding, would have devastated WIA and the employment service programs - a 19 percent overall cut. This year, over 13 million workers, almost one in ten workers nationally, will seek assistance from our nation's employment and training programs. We believe that a skilled workforce is essential to our nation's economic security and these proposed funding cuts would have seriously undermined our ability to compete in the global economy.

We are concerned that the House Labor, HHS, and Education bill contains the \$335 million WIA rescission originally proposed by the Administration. If enacted, this rescission will have a direct and immediate impact on the workforce system's ability to provide these critical services. At least 134,000 workers will not have access to critical job training and related services and a rescission will force One Stop Career Centers around the nation to close their doors.
